ANNUAL TRAINING SCHOOL – 2018

Training School on the implications of missed or rationed nursing care for patient safety, nurse education and management, and policy development.

ORGANISER: School of Nursing and Human Sciences, Dublin City University, Ireland.

DATES: 9th-11th October 2018 (3 days)

CREDITS: 5 ECTS (In order to receive these credits those attending the training school will need to register with Dublin City University as post graduate students. Participation in the training school program, along with successful completion of the assessment component will be required to secure these credits)

Overall Objective:

- To encourage the development of new-in-career researchers, such as PhD students and Early Career Investigators, their research skills (conceptual, theoretical, methodological) and transferable skills (research planning, scientific publication, policy development)

Training School objectives:

On completion of the training school, participants should be able to:

- Explain the key principles and concepts associated with each of the themes of the training school: missed or rationed care, patient safety, education and training implications and policy development.
- Discuss and critically evaluate the relevance of these principles and concepts for their own graduate research project.
- Critically appraise the origins of the concept of care rationing, for the future development of their research project.
- Participate in and further develop a network of researchers to foster knowledge exchange and dissemination of good practices at European and International level.
- Advance a shared international understanding of care rationing in healthcare and its implications for patient safety and nurse education

Who can apply?

PhD students or Early Career Investigators (ECI) from EU or other countries can participate. MSc Students can also apply but PhD and ECI will be given priority in case of more applications than the capacity of the TS (25 applicants).

During the Training School, the trainees will have the opportunity to present their research work for discussion (strongly encouraged); or make a short presentation on a topic of interest. Trainees will have the opportunity for feedback sessions with one of the Trainers.

Financial Support for Participants :

A financial support is possible for a maximum of 20 trainees who wish to apply to it. This applies to participants coming from outside Ireland only. The selection of applicants is based on the application documents and form, which must clearly comply with the overall objectives of the Action's Memorandum of Understanding available in

The following funding conditions will apply:

Each participant from countries other than Ireland will receive a grant (a contribution towards their travel, accommodation and meal expenses) of **650 Euros** each.

Participants from Ireland (other than Dublin) will be partly reimbursed for their travelling to Dublin.

Upon approval of the application form and prior the Training School, Trainees must register on e-COST:

The reimbursement is made after the Training School takes place.

How to apply?

Applicants must apply for participation in the Training School and indicate whether they wish to apply for a trainee grant in the application form. Please note that it is mandatory to complete and submit this form if you wish to participate in the RANCARE Training School 2018, regardless of applying for financial support.

The applicant is responsible to complete and send the application form via email to the Training School Subcoordinator of the Selection Committee, Prof. **Raul Cordeiro** (raulcordeiro@essp.pt); the following documents need to be attached:

- Application letter for participation in the Training School; the letter needs highlight the importance of the Training School for the applicant's research and future career;
- An abstract of ongoing research or current work linked to the Action's overall theme;
- An updated CV (maximum 2 pages).
- Following acceptance to the RANCARE Training School, participants will be required to complete a form for Dublin City University to register as a student on the Training School. This form will be issued to each participant on acceptance to the Training School by the RANCARE selection committee. **This step is very important.**

When to apply?

The call is open from **7 June 2018**

Deadline for the applications submission: **31 July 2018**
