Workshop:

Missed Nursing Care – impacts and interventions

Rationing of nursing care influences learning environments of nursing students and their mentors. It affects also teams and patients. The workshop will focus on structural, process-related and ethical issues of learning environments of nursing students. It will include patients' views and discuss the relevance of teambuilding processes in the context of rationing.

Aims:

- to focus and discuss the impact of missed nursing care on education of nursing students and patients
- to encourage development of knowledge about the ethical dimensions of rationing of nursing care with regard to practical training, team building processes and patients' perceptions
- to facilitate discussion and further knowledge about the importance of the structural framework conditions for the quality of practical training
- to discuss possible interventions to prevent or reduce rationing and missed nursing care in the clinical setting, like strategies and tools improving professional and interprofessional teamwork, strategies and tools to support nurses in prioritization and decision making processes
