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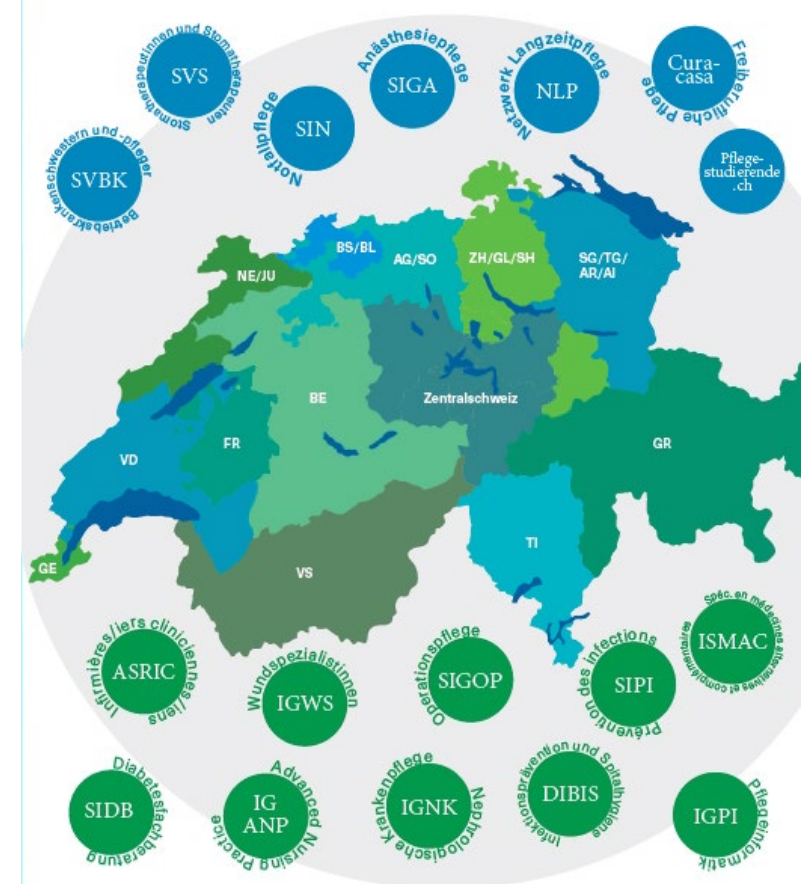
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Swiss Nurse Association goals...

 - for each specialized nursing group.



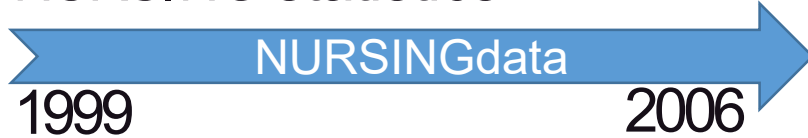
History of an long-term involvement of the SNA
